Alexander McIlwraith is the driving force behind Alpha at Central. Having wrapped up the third Alpha course in December, Alexander is already planning for number four which will begin on January 15, 2018. Alexander was born in Cambridge, attended Southwood Secondary, and completed his degree at Guelph University, going on to work for the university, where he was also involved with the Alpha program. He currently works for Agricorp, an agency of the Government of Ontario, in Communications.

Alpha is an outreach program, which seeks to help people answer some of the big questions of life that we don't often have a chance to examine; questions like "Why does God allow suffering?", "Why am I here?", or "Is there more to life than this?" It seeks to bring hope and faith to those who may feel lost, be suffering from addiction or who feel that God couldn't possible love them. Many of those who attend go from having no faith to being excited and wanting to share their new understanding of how the Holy Spirit can influence their lives. Alpha brings the joy of knowing that God loves them to people of all ages, including those in retirement homes. Through fellowship, talks, discussion, and new understandings, Alpha members experience a growing sense of confidence in their personal lives and in their ability to use their gifts to give back.

Alexander notes that members of the Alpha group have become leaders to help and support others and some have professed their new-found faith by being baptized. Through Alpha, the realization that God is with them, cares for them, and will sustain them, members of this program find the strength to live happier, more hopeful lives.
