Notes from September Session meeting

- **Christian Education:** We are very pleased to announce that Alan Robertson has agreed to lead the Christian Education Team. This is the Session team that ensures we have a great program of Christian Education for all children and youth from nursery age to teens and college students. If you have an interest in being part of this very important part of congregational life at Central, please speak to Alan or any elder. We also want to thank Kerri Beda who is doing a tremendous job as our Interim Children's Ministry Co-ordinator and to the volunteers who are starting up our junior and senior youth groups this fall. Their enthusiasm and great work are ensuring that we have a seamless transition for children and youth.
- **Christian Education Staff Positions:** Central Church has always considered Christian Education one of our most important priorities and the congregation has always supported the hiring of professional staff to lead our ministries to children and youth. In reviewing the various options, it became apparent that different skills and gifts are required for different age groups. For this reason, we are going to hire two part time persons: a Children's and Family Ministries Coordinator, and a Youth Ministries Coordinator. The Christian Education and Personnel Teams are working on developing job descriptions for these two positions and as soon as those are ready, the positions will be advertised. Please pray for everyone involved in this process.
- **Doors Open Waterloo Region September 21:** Once again, Central will be participating from 10 am to 5 pm on Saturday September 21. Last year, over 750 people toured Central at this great event. This year, the Communications Team has prepared plaques for each of our stained glass windows to enhance our visitors' experience.
