WHITE GIFT SUNDAY on Dec. 8

White Gift Sunday has its origins in a Methodist Church in Ohio around the year 1904. There the idea began to give gifts wrapped in white paper to people in need at Christmas. Gifts were given anonymously so that no one would make comparisons on the value of the gifts. Everyone could share in the gift giving and all gifts were appreciated equally.

This year we are once again supporting the Cambridge Self Help Food Bank, focusing on “seniors in need” specifically. This is a group that is often overlooked in our community – many are alone and are living on as little as \$12,000/year for food, rent, clothing, medical and other needs. Some suggestions for gifts are toiletries such as hand lotion, shampoo, and shaving cream, gloves/mittens, hats, scarves, slippers, socks and other clothing items, chocolates/candy. Gifts may be unwrapped or if wrapped, please indicate male (M) or female (F). For many seniors this will be the only gift they receive, and it is a wonderful way to show God’s love in our community.

Please donate any gifts if possible, by Dec. 8 so that the Food Bank has time to distribute the gifts through its many programs. If you would rather that we did the shopping, we will provide labelled envelopes for “White Gift Sunday” beside the Christmas tree in the hall. Please place them in the collection plate on Sunday.

OUR “MITTEN TREE” FOR KIDS

We will place a tree in the hall to collect donations of mittens, hats, scarves and other winter apparel for children and youth in need in our community until Dec. 22.

We consulted the Food Bank who will distribute the items and were told that both newly purchased and “home-made” items would be happily received. If you would rather that we did the shopping, we will provide labelled envelopes for the “Mitten Tree” beside the Christmas tree in the hall to make any donations. Please place them in the collection plate on Sunday. Please help us fill the tree!



SESSION MEETING

- **Goldie Memorial (South) Window:** The window will be repaired and restored by Sunrise Stained Glass, the same company that did the War Memorial Window. The window will be removed sometime in the next few weeks and re-installed next spring when weather permits.
- **Children's and Family Ministry:** Kerri Beda was originally hired as the interim Children's and Family Ministry coordinator for a period of six months from June to December 2019. We are very pleased that Kerri has agreed to stay on in this interim role until the end of June.
- **Youth Ministry Coordinator:** The part time position has been advertised and 29 applications were received. Interviews took place on November 9.
- **Central Cares:** Central does a lot of work to help those in need in our community. We also want to make sure that people in our own congregation are looked after in times of need as well. We would like to develop a list of people who can prepare meals on occasion, who will drive people to church events etc. Is this something you could help with? If so, speak to any elder or give your name to Debbie in the office.
- **Stage Lighting:** The Worship Team has purchased stage lighting for the sanctuary. This is the same lighting that was rented last year for the Christmas Eve service. Each unit was purchased on sale for about a third of the retail price. Their current location is temporary. They will be mounted in a much higher location that will work well for everyone.
