**Toonies for Rachel's Home**  
**Sunday December 15th**

We have received some critical news from Rachel's Home, the AIDS orphanage and community school that we support as our international mission. Lesotho and other parts of southern Africa are suffering one of the worst droughts in many years and Hilda, the housemother of the orphanage, tells us that their vegetable garden has totally failed. This means the children are without a supply of vegetables to supplement their diets. There is no "Veggie Patch" for these children unless we can help them.

So, we are responding to their need by providing a program called "Toonies for Rachel's Home". We are asking each person in our congregation to donate on Dec. 15, the day of our Children's Christmas Pageant. Keep a look out for Christmas stockings to donate your toonies. For the cost of just one coffee or one chocolate bar, we will be able to provide some vegetables throughout the drought, a Christmas dinner and a Christmas gift of one clothing item such as a T-shirt for each orphan and community school child.

Please help to ensure that no child is forgotten this Christmas as we show God's love to those so desperately in need.

Thank you for your faithfulness and generosity in the lives of these children.

## WHITE GIFT SUNDAY TODAY!!!

White Gift Sunday has its origins in a Methodist Church in Ohio around the year 1904. There the idea began to give gifts wrapped in white paper to people in need at Christmas. Gifts were given anonymously so that no one would make comparisons on the value of the gifts. Everyone could share in the gift giving and all gifts were appreciated equally.

This year we are once again supporting the Cambridge Self Help Food Bank, focusing on “seniors in need” specifically. This is a group that is often overlooked in our community – many are alone and are living on as little as \$12,000/year for food, rent, clothing, medical and other needs. Some suggestions for gifts are toiletries such as hand lotion, shampoo, and shaving cream, gloves/mittens, hats, scarves, slippers, socks and other clothing items, chocolates/candy. Gifts may be unwrapped or if wrapped, please indicate male (M) or female (F). For many seniors this will be the only gift they receive, and it is a wonderful way to show God’s love in our community.

Please donate any gifts if possible, so that the Food Bank has time to distribute the gifts through its many programs.

If you would rather that we did the shopping, we will provide labelled envelopes for “White Gift Sunday” beside the Christmas tree in the hall. Please place them in the collection plate.

### OUR “MITTEN TREE” FOR KIDS

## WHO DOES WHAT?

**Session:** The Session is responsible for overseeing all groups and activities that take place within the congregation including Christian Education, children's and youth programs, adult groups, missions, outreach, some aspects of worship, stewardship and pastoral care for everyone in the congregation. Members of session are elected by the congregation and ordained as ruling elders.

**Board of Managers:** The Board of Managers is responsible for keeping the building and other property in good condition and for managing the finances and keeping financial records. Members of the Board are elected by the congregation.

**Trustees:** As required by law in Ontario, trustees are people who represent the congregation in legal matters. For example, if the congregation were to take out a mortgage, the trustees would sign on behalf of the congregation. Trustees are appointed by the congregation.
