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NAME CHANGES FOR FINANCIAL DONATIONS

With the activation of the roof project, and to avoid confusion, the Board of Managers has approved a series of name changes for donations. Those who are on PAR will be able to designate donations to each fund separately.

- a) Restore Central Project Fund (formerly the Roof Fund)
 This fund has been established to include both exterior (roof, masonry, etc.) and interior (electrical, etc.) renovations.
 Previous donations to the Roof Fund are included in this fund.
- b) Preservation Emergency Fund (formerly the Preservation Fund) This fund was established to ensure that there are capital funds in reserve for emergencies such as a new boiler.
- c) Life and Work of the Church

ROOF AND STONEWORK UPDATE

The south-western part of the slate roof has been removed and a temporary watertight membrane has been installed on the roof deck. Removal of slates from the south-eastern is almost complete and will be covered by a watertight membrane also. Work has begun on cutting slates to duplicate the existing pattern currently found on the roof. A mock-up of the copper flashings and eavestrough has also been submitted.
