<sup>7</sup> He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

8 By oppression and judgment he was taken away. Yet who of his generation protested?

For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was punished.

<sup>9</sup> He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death,

though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.

Yet it was the LORD's will to crush him and cause him to suffer and though the LORD makes his life an offering for sin,

he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the LORD will prosper in his hand.

<sup>11</sup> After he has suffered,

he will see the light of life and be satisfied;

by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities.

<sup>12</sup> Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong,

because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors.

For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.



# Lent 2023 Gospel Reading Plan.

(All Four Gospels in 40 Days)

Lent is the time during which we reflect on the life of our Lord, Jesus Christ. This year I want to challenge you not to give something up for Lent but to take something on.

Inside you will find a suggested reading plan that will help you read through all four the Gospels during the 40 days of Lent (excluding Sundays). The readings are planned so that you can read two or three chapters daily.

There are no readings planned for Sundays, these days are set aside for you to catch up on some of the readings you might have missed during the week or perhaps you can re-read a specific passage again.

The idea of doing these readings is not to hurry through to get to the end; it is to help you focus on Jesus and your relationship with Him. Don't get discouraged if you fall behind this is only a suggested plan. Please feel free to personalise the plan according to your own needs.

The most important thing about following this plan is to make it a spiritual enriching experience and to spend time in God's word.
